# How the healthy food given my

First Alliance Church (FAC) has been distributing fresh fruit and vegetables since March 2019. At that time, we invited people into our gym and walked them through the choices with a grocery bag.



In the fall of 2022, we partnered with the <u>Capital Area Food Bank</u> (CAFB), which required us to increase the frequency of our events. This was made possible with the generous assistance of our many church and community partners (see pg 8). Working together and with God's help, we've made it happen for the last two years.

Through our partnership with <u>Manna Food Center</u>, we built a pantry and bought a freezer to safely store food between events. A grant from CAFB allowed us to purchase a refrigerator. We hold a drive-in event each second Saturday, and on the fourth Tuesday we host a food pantry where our guests can come in and select from a variety of foods.

Feed the hungry, and help those in trouble.

#### Pur Vision and Mission



- Our food is purchased from the <u>Capital Area Food Bank</u>.
- We received four grants from Montgomery County via CAFB which allowed us to purchase over \$15,000 worth of food for under \$2,000.
- We are extremely grateful to <u>Sprouts Farmers Market of Burtonsville</u> for their generous donation of 5,000 heavy-duty, reusable plastic bags, which saved thousands of dollars.
- We hosted a hot dog meal in August and a Thanksgiving meal in November.
- Equipment purchases include another iPad, iPad cases, carts, and traffic cones.
- A texting service allows us to remind our guests of each event.
- Supplies include office supplies and materials for signs. We also purchased t-shirts, hand warmers and ponchos for those snowy mornings, and safety vests for our volunteers.

<u>First Alliance Church</u> was started in the 1930s, originally within the city limits of Washington. We moved to Silver Spring in the 70s and continue to be a place where all are welcome.
