

¹ In the seventh month, on the twenty-first day of the month, the word of the LORD came by the hand of Haggai the prophet: ² "Speak now to Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, governor of Judah, and to Joshua the son of Jehoza-dak, the high priest, and to all the remnant of the people, and say, ³ 'Who is left among you who saw this house in its former glory?
