





## Second Scripture Lesson

<sup>20</sup> “Asher’s food shall be rich,  
and he shall yield royal delicacies.  
<sup>21</sup> “Naphtali is a doe let loose  
that bears beautiful fawns.  
<sup>22</sup> “Joseph is a fruitful bough,  
a fruitful bough by a spring;  
his branches run over the wall.  
<sup>23</sup> The archers bitterly attacked him,  
shot at him, and harassed him severely,  
<sup>24</sup> yet his bow remained unmoved;  
his arms were made agile

by the hands of the Mighty One of Jacob  
(from there is the Shepherd, the Stone of  
Israel),  
<sup>25</sup> by the God of your father who will help you,  
by the Almighty who will bless you  
with blessings of heaven above,  
blessings of the deep that crouches beneath,  
blessings of the breasts and of the womb.  
<sup>26</sup> The blessings of your father  
are mighty beyond the blessings of my  
parents,  
up to the bounties of the everlasting hills.  
May they be on the head of Joseph,
