
#### The Lord's Supper

## First Scripture Lesson

<sup>8</sup> Woe to those who join house to house, who add field to field, until there is no more room, and you are made to dwell alone

in the midst of the land.

<sup>9</sup> The LORD of hosts has sworn in my hearing: "Surely many houses shall be desolate,

large and beautiful houses, without inhabitant.

<sup>10</sup> For ten acres of vineyard shall yield but one bath,

and a homer of seed shall yield but an ephah."

<sup>11</sup>Woe to those who rise early in the morning, that they may run after strong drink,

who tarry late into the evening as wine inflames them!

<sup>12</sup> They have lyre and harp, tambourine and flute and wine at their feasts.

but they do not regard the deeds of the LORD, or see the work of his hands.

<sup>13</sup> Therefore my people go into exile for lack of knowledge;

their honored men go hungry, and their multitude is parched with thirst.

<sup>14</sup>Therefore Sheol has enlarged its appetite and opened its mouth beyond measure, and the nobility of Jerusalem and her multitude will go down,

her revelers and he who exults in her.

<sup>15</sup> Man is humbled, and each one is brought low, and the eyes of the haughty are brought low.

<sup>16</sup> But the LORD of hosts is exalted in justice, and the Holy God shows himself holy in righteousness. <sup>17</sup>Then shall the lambs graze as in their pasture, and nomads shall eat among the ruins of the rich.

<sup>18</sup> Woe to those who draw iniquity with cords of falsehood,

who draw sin as with cart ropes,

<sup>19</sup> who say: "Let him be quick, let him speed his work that we may see it;

let the counsel of the Holy One of Israel draw near,

and let it come, that we may know it!"

<sup>20</sup> Woe to those who call evil good and good evil,

who put darkness for light and light for darkness,

who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter!

<sup>21</sup> Woe to those who are wise in their own eyes, and shrewd in their own sight!

<sup>22</sup>Woe to those who are heroes at drinking wine, and valiant men in mixing strong drink,

<sup>23</sup> who acquit the guilty for a bribe, and deprive the innocent of his right!

<sup>24</sup> Therefore, as the tongue of fire devours the stubble,

and as dry grass sinks down in the flame, so their root will be as rottenness,

and their blossom go up like dust; for they have rejected the law of the LORD of hosts,

and have despised the word of the Holy One of Israel.

<sup>25</sup> Therefore the anger of the LORD was kindled against his people,

and he stretched out his hand against them and struck them,

and the mountains quaked; and their corpses were as refuse in the midst of the streets. For all this his anger has not turned away, and his hand is stretched out still.

He will raise a signal for nations far away, and whistle for them from the ends of the earth;
and behold, quickly, speedily they come!
None is weary, none stumbles, none slumbers or sleeps, not a waistband is loose, not a sandal strap broken;

their arrows are sharp, all their bows bent,
their horses' hoofs seem like flint, and their wheels like the whirlwind.
Their roaring is like a lion, like young lions they roar;
they growl and seize their prey; they carry it off, and none can rescue.
They will growl over it on that day, like the growling of the sea.
And if one looks to the land, behold, darkness and distress;
and the light is darkened by its clouds.

## Second Scripture Lesson

<sup>1</sup>On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. <sup>2</sup>Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. <sup>3</sup> When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." <sup>4</sup>And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." <sup>5</sup> His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

<sup>6</sup>Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. <sup>7</sup>Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. <sup>8</sup> And he said to

them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it. <sup>9</sup> When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom <sup>10</sup> and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now." <sup>11</sup> This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.
