¹ The oracle concerning the valley of vision.

What do you mean that you have gone up,
all of you, to the housetops,

In that day you looked to the weapons of the House of the Forest, ⁹ and you saw that the breaches of the city of David were many. You collected the waters of the lower pool, ¹⁰ and you counted the houses of Jerusalem, and you broke down the houses to fortify the wall. ¹¹ You made a reservoir

between the two walls for the water of the old pool. But you did not look to him who did it, or see him who planned it long ago.

¹² In that day the Lord GOD of hosts
called for weeping and mourning,
for baldness and wearing sackcloth;

¹³ and behold, joy and gladness,
killing oxen and slaughtering sheep,
eating flesh and drinking wine.

“Let us eat and drink,
for tomorrow we die.”

¹⁴ The LORD of hosts has revealed himself
in my ears:

“Surely this iniquity will not be atoned for you
until you die,”

says the Lord GOD of hosts.

¹⁵ Thus says the Lord GOD of hosts,
“Come, go to this steward, to Shebna,
who is over the household, and say to him:

¹⁶ What have you to do here, and whom
have you here, that you have cut out here a
tomb for yourself, you who cut out a tomb
on the height and carve a dwelling for your-
self in the rock? ¹⁷ Behold, the LORD will
hurl you away violently, O you strong man.

He will seize firm hold on you ¹⁸ and whirl
you around and around, and throw you like
a ball into a wide land. There you shall die,
and there shall be your glorious chariots, you
shame of your master’s house. ¹⁹ I will thrust
you from your office, and you will be pulled
down from your station. ²⁰ In that day I will
call my servant Eliakim the son of Hilkiah,
²¹ and I will clothe him with your robe, and
will bind your sash on him, and will commit
your authority to his hand. And he shall be
a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and

to the house of Judah. ²² And I will place on his shoulder the key of the house of David. He shall open, and none shall shut; and he shall shut, and none shall open. ²³ And I will fasten him like a peg in a secure place, and he will become a throne of honor to his father's house. ²⁴ And they will hang on him the whole honor of his father's house, the offspring and issue, every small vessel,

from the cups to all the flagons. ²⁵ In that day, declares the LORD of hosts, the peg that was fastened in a secure place will give way, and it will be cut down and fall, and the load that was on it will be cut off, for the LORD has spoken."

Second Scripture Lesson

⁵³ They went each to his own house,

¹ but Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. ² Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them. ³ The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery, and placing her in the midst ⁴ they said to him, "Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. ⁵ Now in the Law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" ⁶ This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. ⁷ And as they

continued to ask him, he stood up and said to them, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her." ⁸ And once more he bent down and wrote on the ground. ⁹ But when they heard it, they went away one by one, beginning with the older ones, and Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him. ¹⁰ Jesus stood up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" ¹¹ She said, "No one, Lord." And Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more."
