Sermon Meditations: Confidence in God

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:10-28
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "Prepared." The servant made preparation for his journey to find the bride. Before he loaded up the camels and the gifts, how did vs 6-7 prepare him? Why is important that we know who God is and what he promises if we are going to be faithful servants? In what ways has God called us to serve him as believers?

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:10-28
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second points was "Prayerful." God had gone before the servant but not yet revealed to him who he was looking for. What is the first thing we seeing the servant doing when he arrives at the well? Why is prayer so important to the servant's mission? We are called as servants of Christ, what things should we be praying for as a part of our mission in this world?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:10-28
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "Pursuing." Our faith is to be passive and active. In other words, we trust God in all things, walk in obedience, and reveal our weakness in prayer, but there are also things we are to do in action. We are called as servants to share the gospel. What does it mean to pursue others with the gospel? How are we to prepare ourselves, pray, and pursue the lost?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
