Sermon Meditations: The Invitation of God

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 12:44-50
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "The Word that Saves". Jesus cried out in a loud voice for the last time publicly. He tells the people that the only way to see God and know God is through him. What does Jesus teach us about God? What does Christ call people to believe? How does this word save us?
- Close in prayer

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 12:44-50
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "The Word that Judges". Jesus said that he didn't come to judge but save the world. What does he mean that he hasn't come to judge? Does this mean that we won't be judged? How does this show the importance of God's word for our salvation? What will be the way in which we are judged on the last day in accordance with the word's Jesus has spoken?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 12:44-50
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "The Command that is Eternal Life". Jesus says that he has spoken on the authority of his Father. He was sent with a command. What is the command Jesus was given? Take time to review the book in crucial moments to contemplate the things he has said concerning eternal life. See how many you can remember to help seal it in your mind.

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
