Sermon Meditations: And He Loved Her

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:62-67
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Happily ever after is coming: God's perfect faithfulness on display." This passage is the resolution of all of Genesis 24. Name all the people God has been faithful to in Genesis 24 and how he has been faithful. It is a tour de force of God's love, grace, and faithfulness. He is the same faithful God to you.

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:62-67; Philippians 1:6
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Happily ever after is coming: Our sanctification resolves into glorification." These closing verses anticipate the day we will be presented to Christ as a bride made ready. We are being made ready, but on that day the work will be done – we will be perfect. Sanctification is hard, but he who began a good work in us will be faithful to bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 24:62-67; Revelation 19:6-10
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Happily ever after is coming: Once betrothed, we will be wed." Christ is already ours in so many ways, but a day is coming when we will see him face-to-face and eat the marriage supper of the Lamb together. Our faith like a mustard seed will be justified forever. Christ will be ours in every good and perfect sense of the word.

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
