**Sermon Meditations: The Love of Christ**

**Monday**

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 13:31-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "The Glory of Christ Revealed in His Cross Work". Verses 31-32 speak of the Father and Son glorifying one another. Christ glorifies the Father in his obedience, going to the cross to redeem us from our sin. The Father glorifies the Son in raising him from the dead. In this we see the love of Christ for the Father, the love of Christ for us, and the love of the Father for Christ. What wisdom of God! That by the cross we should be saved, God should be glorified, and love should be the tie that binds. O the splendor and majesty of our Savior!

**Tuesday**

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 13:31-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "The Love of Christ Demonstrated in His Cross Work". Christ issues his command twice and in between provides the standard and definition of love: Just as I have loved you. Christ's love is a sacrificial love. It is a love that puts others ahead of self. It is an obedient love, obeying God in heaven. It is a trusting love, trusting his Father in heaven. Christ says we are to obey and trust the Father and therefore love one another sacrificially. How can you love your brothers and sisters in Christ this week? What do they need that you can provide?

**Wednesday**

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 13:31-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "The Salvation of Christ Alone in His Cross Work". Though we follow Christ's pattern, his cross work was unique. No one can add to it or help it. Christ suffered alone for our sakes. Only in Christ can we find forgiveness of our sins and eternal life enjoyed in the presence of the Triune God. Are you looking to Christ alone for your salvation?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
