Sermon Meditations: Greater Works than These

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:8-14; Be Thou My Vision (Trinity Hymnal 642)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Christ, Our Vision". The promise of the gospel is not just escape from hell or even comfort in heaven, but the promise of seeing God – not just the way we see with our eyes, but knowing him and recognizing him and being in perfect relationship with him. This promise is fulfilled in Jesus Christ. He is our vision of God. What a great gift God has given us!

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:8-14
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "The Church's Work". Now that Christ has begun the work of redemption on the cross, we are commissioned and sent out by him to continue the work in the world. Our worship and service, proclaiming the gospel, are our works as we wait for Christ's return. How can you be about the Father's work this week?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:8-14
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "The Church's Words". The work God does in the world he accomplishes through our prayers. The Church speaks and God answers our prayers by working. Will you spend time this week in prayer to God, asking him to work in the world?

Thursday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 14:15-17
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 14:15-17
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
