Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: Our God Does All Things Well

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 1:3; John 1:1-5; Revelation 21:22-27; Psalm 119:105
Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point on Sunday was "Our God is the Source of All Wisdom."
- After reading the passages above, what does it mean that God's Word is the source of light? How will you apply that in your life this week?
- Close in prayer.

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 1:3-25
Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point on Sunday was "Our God is the Source of All Good Order."
- God gave order to all things in the creation account. What does this say about God? What does it say about us and the world we live in? Parents of children still living at home: This is a good opportunity to address the ways our culture is rejecting God's order and seeking to impose its own.
- Close in prayer.

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 1:11-13, 20-25
Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point on Sunday was "Our God is the Source of All Life."
- What does it tell us about life – all life – that it was given by God? Is it ours to take away unjustly? Is it ours to give to others? Does life have value and what does it mean that it has value – who or what gave it value?
- Close in prayer.

Preparing Our Hearts to Receive the Word

Thursday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 1:1-2:3 (or 1:1-19)
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?
- Close in Prayer

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 1:1-2:3 (or 1:20-2:3)
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
- Close in Prayer

Note: Gen 1:1-2:3 might be more reading than you have time for during this family worship each day. If so, perhaps divide it into two readings, one for Thursday and one for Friday. We will be reading these verses for the next several weeks, so you should become quite familiar with them.
