Sermon Meditations: You Are Not Orphans!

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:18-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "A Manifestation of Presence". Jesus' encouragement to his disciples is that he will not leave them as orphans. He tells them that he will come to them. Why does he have to leave them? In what way will he come to them and thus to all believers? How does Christ's presence with us comfort us now? What encouragement does the resurrection of Jesus give to us?

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:18-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "A Manifestation of Relationship". Jesus is seeking to give his people assurance by his presence. What is the practical evidence of his presence and relationship with us? What is expected of us in relationship to Jesus? What does Jesus promise to give us in this relationship? What are the means by which we may see and know that Jesus available to us now?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 14:18-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "A Manifestation of Hearing". Why can the world not see or know Jesus? What place does his word have in the life of the believer? How does the Spirit apply the word to us? What is the ongoing effect of having Christ's presence in us?

- Read: John 14:25-31
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 14:25-31
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
