Hiding God's Word in Our Hearts

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Read Psalm 2, and pay special attention to verse 12
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point Sunday was that "no other refuge can defend us from God's wrath." What are some ways we are tempted to seek refuge apart from God? What things or people other than God do we sometimes find ourselves thinking can save us? Provide ultimate safety?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 9:22-24 and 56-57
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "God's wrath is just." Do you sometimes find yourself thinking God is too harsh in his wrath against sin? Do you find yourself thinking you don't deserve God's wrath? Can you think of any passages of Scripture that teach us that God's wrath – even against our own sin – is justified?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 9:21
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point on Sunday was "the world's schemes are futile." We all get caught up at times in our own life story and lose sight of the big picture. When we do, our circumstances seem more important than they really are. What are some circumstances right now or in recent weeks in your life that have taken on this oversized importance and need to be downsized? How do we put them back in their appropriate place?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 10:1-16
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 10:1-16
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scripture principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
