Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: Above All

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 3:22-36
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "We exist to serve God." In verses 27-30 John the Baptist answers his disciples' confusion by making it clear: I serve Christ – the bridegroom. He has now come. My role is coming to an end and I must diminish. John understands that no matter how important his ministry is, he is a servant to Christ. It can be easy to forget that Christ does not exist to serve us, but we exist to serve him. How are you serving Christ in your life? What are some ways you can begin to do so?

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 3:22-36
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Christ's Identity and Mission." John (our author) tells us in verses 31-32 that Christ has come from above to testify with authority. We have heard this several times in John's gospel already, which suggests that it is a central theme of his gospel. The gospel comes to us as Jesus' own testimony with full authority. We are called to believe it!

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 3:22-36
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "A Matter of Life and Death." In verses 33-36 we are reminded that whether we believe Christ's message is a matter of life and death. We are already condemned. Will we be saved? Do you believe Christ's testimony? Or are you still under the wrath of God?

- Read: John 4:1-15
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 4:1-15
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
