Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Does God Forsake Sinners?

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Read Judges 10:6-9, and pay special attention to the distress Israel is in.
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point Sunday was that "Sin is not our friend." What was the outcome of Israel abandoning God? How do you feel toward your sin? Where can we go with our sin?
- Close in Prayer

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 10:10-14
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "God sets the terms of salvation." What do we learn from this passage about God's power to save? What is the Lord teaching Israel about the gods they serve in vs. 14? What does God desire most from his people?
- Close in Prayer

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 10:15-16
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point on Sunday was "Our only hope is God's mercy." What changed in Israel's confession in vs. 15 compared to vs. 10? Pastor Nathan said there is two kinds of repentance, attrition (sorrow for being caught) and contrition (sorrow for offending God). How does vs. 16 teach us what is required in true repentance? How do we turn from our sin?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Luke 22:14-23
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?
- Close in Prayer

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 10:1-16
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scripture principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
