Sermon Meditations: Ladder of Mercy

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 28:10-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "God meets us where we are." Jacob is in a tough place. Alone. Cast away from his home. No one with him. But God meets him there in his trouble. Has God ever met you in your trouble? Do you believe he will?
- Close in prayer

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 28:10-22; John 1:51
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "God assures us of his promises and faithfulness." When God met Jacob, it was not to chide or correct, but to assure him of his faithfulness and care. He did this with both a sign and words. And in both we see Christ. Can you think of ways we see Christ?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 28:10-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Our response is to believe and worship." Jacob responds with awe and worship of God. Are we quick to give thanks when God meets us in our troubles?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Read: Genesis 29:1-30
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
