**Instruction:** Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

**The Lamb of God**

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Read Luke 22:7-13, Romans 6:23, and Hebrews 9:22.
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point Sunday was "The Wages of Sin is Death." What does the continual sacrifice of the Passover Lamb teach us about sin? What does Hebrews 9:22 teach us about the necessity of Christ's death? How is his death different from the Passover Lamb in the Old Testament?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Luke 22:14-20 and 1 Peter 1:18-21.
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "Christ is our Passover Lamb." Why does Christ greatly desire a meal that also indicates he will suffer? What does this teach us about the love of Christ for sinners? How do we prepare ourselves for Communion? Pastor Nathan spoke about a great exchange between Christ and us. What do we give in this exchange and what do we receive from Christ?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Read Luke 22:14-20 and Revelation 3:20.
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point on Sunday was "Communion is a feast received by faith and repentance." What are the commands Christ gives us at the Lord's Supper? Why is Communion not simply receiving, but also requires repentance? If we see the great sacrifice of Christ represented in Communion, how should this make us feel towards our sin? What encouragement does Communion give to the believer?

Thursday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Revelation 19:1-10
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Revelation 19:1-10
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
