Who is the Man who will fight for us?

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Read 10:17-11:11, Isa 53:3-6
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point Sunday was "Christ was despised and rejected by men." How does Christ face the enemy for us? God delights to use those things which seem weak. What is our condition in our sin? How was Christ treated in our place?
- Close in Prayer

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 11:12-26, Romans 8:1-4, 31-34
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "The enemy has no charge against God's elect." How does Jephthah reveal that he has taken up the cause of Israel in vs. 12? How does Christ take up our cause in salvation? What does it mean that no charge can be brought against God's people because Christ is our advocate?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 11:27-28
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point on Sunday was "Jesus is the Righteous Judge." God is Judge over
 all people. How does God pass over us in judgment if we have believed in Christ? We are called to listen to
 Christ and follow after him. How do we receive the benefits of Christ sacrifice for us? (Faith and
 Repentance). What is the tragedy of the Ammonites not listening to the Jephthah's description of God as
 Judge?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 11:29-40
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 11:29-40
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
