Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: Judgment and Grace

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 3:8-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point on Sunday was "Hiding From God". What impact do we see sin has caused in vs. 8? Why do you think God asks Adam and Eve questions if he already knows everything? These opening verses teach us that we can't hide our sin. What are we supposed to do every time we sin? Contemplate that we can't hide our sin, nor should we blame others for our own sin.

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 3:8-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point on Sunday was "The Curse of Sin". We first examined vs. 14-24 in light of the curse. In vs. 15 what does it mean that there will be enmity between the serpent and the offspring of the woman? Why will sin be an ongoing struggle for our first parents and for us? What does vs. 19 tell us will happen to mankind? Why did God drive Adam and Eve out of the garden?
- Close in prayer.

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 3:8-24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point on Sunday was "The Grace of God". Go back over vs. 14-24 and name the ways God has shown grace towards Adam and Eve. How does Gen 3:15 point us toward the Messiah? What do the new clothes that God makes for Adam and Eve show us about our own efforts to cover our shame and nakedness before God?

- Read: Genesis 4:1-16
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 4:1-16
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
