Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Faithless Presumption

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 16:1-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point Sunday was "Flee from temptation and sin." You might ask the question: What sins do I put up with in my life? Encourage family members to meditate silently on this and determine not to put up with those sins any longer.

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 16:1-22; Romans 12:3-8
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Do not squander your gifts." Samson squandered his gifts. Do you know what your spiritual gifts are? Are you using them in service to the church? If not, discuss how can you begin to do so. Encourage one another by helping each one discover their spiritual gift.

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 16:22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point on Sunday was "Hope in the promises of God." In the face of temptation, sin, and spiritual laziness it is easy to despair. Remember that God does not abandon his people. Repent and by the power of the Spirit, renew your pursuit of righteousness. What are some biblical examples of God not abandoning his people, even when they sin?

- Read: Judges 16:23-31
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Read: Judges 16:23-31
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
