Sermon Meditations: One in Christ

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 17:20-26
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "That they may be one...". The first thing we must understand about this unity is that we will one day be in perfect fellowship with the Triune God, participating in all his own happiness in himself. This is our end – our telos. All the promises of God are fulfilled in this participation – this beatific vision. This is what Christ asks the Father to give and the Father will surely give it.

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 17: 20-26
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "That the world may know...". But this participation, while not yet perfect, has already begun. The Spirit indwells us. And our being drawn into the fellowship of the Trinity is an expression of God's love for us and spills over into our love for one another, and for the lost. As it is realized, the world will come to know that Christ is the Son of God, sent by the Father, and that the Father loves Jesus and us. If we know the Father's love, and love the Father in return, we will not be able to hold back telling others about Jesus.

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 17: 20-26
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "That they may be with me where I am...". Jesus wants you to be in heaven – he desires it! – and he is patiently waiting, just as we are patiently waiting. What a tremendous encouragement!

- Read: John 18:1-12
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:1-12
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
