Sermon Meditations: Jehovah Jireh

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:1-15; Numbers 11:10-15
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "The Abundance of Christ's Compassion." Christ, "lifting up his eyes," saw the crowd approaching. He then assumed the responsibility to feed them all! The people are not fed because Jesus is bound by social custom to feed them. To the contrary! He is trying to get away from the crowds! It is only his infinite compassion that moves him to provide for his people. Jesus loves you!

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:1-15
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "The Abundance of Our Need." The people needed food, yes, but they needed something greater than food – they needed the bread of life. Our need is great. We cannot save ourselves. We cannot put away our own sin and guilt. We cannot give life to ourselves. We stand condemned; dead in our trespasses and sin. Who will rescue us?!

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:1-15; Numbers 11:18-23; 31
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "The Abundance of Christ's Provision" When Christ meets a need, he does so abundantly. Bread and fish are overflowing in this passage, but they are only symbols of the abundance with which Christ meets the real need. All the forgiveness you need is yours in Christ. All the grace, love, hope, faith, and life you need are yours in Christ, eternally. There will be no shortage. There will be no waste.

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
