**Sermon Meditations: True Reconciliation**

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 33:1-20
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "The Marks of Sincere Repentance". Jacob was gone 20 years and grew in his faith and as a result he repented of his sin. What are some of the ways he expressed repentance? What does this teach us about repentance and how we should repent?
- Close in prayer

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 33:1-20
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "The Motives of Sincere Forgiveness". We haven't seen or heard from Esau since Jacob fled. However, he genuinely forgave Jacob! What are the signs of his forgiveness? Are we willing to forgive others in this same way?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 33:1-20
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "The Blessings of True Reconciliation". What do Jacob and Laban gain as a result of their repentance and forgiveness? What do we gain from our own repentance before God? And when we forgive others?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Read: Genesis 34:1-31
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
