Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point Sunday was "The problem is syncretism." Syncretism is when we attempt live and worship the true God according to the values of the world. What are some ways the world has influenced you or your family's thinking about what it means to be a Christian, or what matters when worshipping God?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "The cause is ignorance of God's Word." Learning God's Word is a lifelong effort. What ways has God taught us to follow in order to learn his Word? What specific ways can you grow in this area?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point on Sunday was "The cure is fealty to the King." Fealty means sworn loyalty to a lord. If we have sworn such loyalty, then we will care deeply what our Lord has said and what he has commanded. We will seek with all our hearts to obey him. And we will be grieved when we fail. Do these describe your heart? If not, pray that God will change your heart so that they do describe you!

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
