Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: I Am

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:16-21
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Christ comes to us in the storm." No matter where we are – under the storms of God's wrath for sin, or in the storms of God's sanctifying work in us – Christ comes to us to comfort us. Christ loves you. What storms are you in the midst of now? Sin you are fighting. Relationships that are hard. Significant loss in your life. Christ comes to you in these and provides comfort.

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:16-21; Psalm 146
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Christ speaks to us in the storm." Christ comforts us in life's storms by speaking to us. He reveals himself. He tells us that despite our circumstances, who he is to us is reason enough not to fear. If you are afraid today, remember who Christ is. He is God, sovereign over all things. Remember who he is to you – your refuge in these storms. He will never fail you.

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 6:16-21
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Christ delivers us through the storm." The disciples are eager to receive him into the boat and John tells us they arrived safely on the other side. It's interesting that here John doesn't record that the sea was calmed. Christ is our refuge and those the storms of life may rage, though the wrath of God is falling on those who rebel against him, we are safe and will arrive safely on Jordan's far shore.

- Read: John 6:22-40
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 6:22-40
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
