**Instruction:** Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

**Where is my inheritance?**

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 18
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "Who is your king?" What does the opening verse reveal about the hearts of those in Israel? How has God shown himself to be a king to Israel? What does it mean to have Christ rule over our hearts? Verse 6 says, "The journey you go on is under the eye of the Lord." How does this instruct the way we live? What may we do when we fail in the eyes of the Lord?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 18:7-20
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "What is precious to you?" After reading the passage what things did the Danites consider most precious? What did the Levite consider most precious? What did Micah consider most precious? Why were those precious things to them wrong headed? What does Christ offer to us as most precious and how do we balance that with the desires of our heart?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Psalm 24
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point on Sunday was "God will not share his glory." Israel failed to remember how God had graciously saved them. The whole of the bible teaches us of the saving nature of God towards sinners. Why should Christ receive all the glory? What is our hope as sinners in vs. 5-6? How do we give God the glory he deserves?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Romans 12:9-21
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Romans 12:9-21
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
