Sermon Meditations: Humbled by Sin

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:12-27 (Focused on Peter's Betrayal)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Fellowship with the World". Peter stands around a fire, enjoying the warmth and the fellowship of the servants and officers. It is in stark contrast to Christ who is alone in the cold. Our fellowship cannot be with this world and with Christ. We are not of this world. What does it look like to live as those who are strangers and aliens?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:12-27 (Focused on Peter's Betrayal)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Helpless by Ourselves". Peter swore he would die with Christ, but he can't even admit to a servant girl that he is a disciple of Christ. Christ has embarked on a great saving work that only he can accomplish and which we are helpless to accomplish. Our works are worthless. Apart from Christ all is lost. Cling to Christ!

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:12-27 (Focused on Peter's Betrayal)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Christ Alone". Peter is both incapable of joining Christ in this work and would be of no value if he could. Christ must stand alone. Only Christ, the sinless God-man, is a fit sacrifice for our sins. Give thanks to God for his love expressed in and through Jesus Christ for us, sinners and rebels.

- Read: John 18:12-27 (Focused on Jesus before the High Priest)
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:12-27 (Focused on Jesus before the High Priest)
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
