Sermon Meditations: Noah: Adam 2.0, But Not the Second Adam

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 9:18-29
- Meditation: Pastor Joel showed us that Noah and his sons went forth from the ark and were to disperse throughout the world. How has God shown his grace towards this family? Does this mean that sin is finished? Why do we need God's grace still today?
- Close in prayer

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 9:18-29
- Meditation: Pastor Joel showed how sin was still present even after the flood. God also promised that he would never flood the earth again. It is clear that sin is still present as Noah was found in his sin and Ham also sinned in the way he looked upon his father. Noah's sin needed to be covered over. How does God deal with our sin now and how is it "covered over?"

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 9:18-29
- Meditation: Pastor Joel showed how Canaan would be cursed because of the sin of Ham and how the other two sons received a blessing. In Gen 3 God said that there will be enmity between the offspring of the serpent and the offspring of Eve. How do we receive the blessing of God in salvation rather than the curse of God's wrath for our sin? Read 2 Cor 5:21. Jesus took our sin on himself rather than us having to bear the penalty for our sin.

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
