Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: What Is Truth?

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:33-38a
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "Who is Jesus?" Pilate asks Jesus if he is king of the Jews. This is his first real introduction to him. Ultimately Pilate is trying to figure out who Jesus is and why he is hated by the Jews. Why is it the most important question to ask who Jesus is? Jesus answers Pilate's question in vs. 34. Each person much answer the question about Jesus' identity personally. How are we to respond to Jesus as king? What does he do for us as our king?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:33-38a
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "Which kingdom do you belong to?" Pilate tries to dismiss Jesus' response to him in vs. 34 by claiming he is not a Jew. He doesn't think Jesus has any bearing on his life. Why can we not simply dismiss Jesus? How does Pilate reflect the world's response to Jesus? How many kingdoms truly exist in the world? Which kingdom are you a part of and how to do we align ourselves with Jesus' kingdom?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 18:33-38a
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "Do you know what is true?" The reason that Jesus came into the world was to reveal truth. The world is filled with lies under the kingdom of Satan. What is the truth about Jesus? Spend some time naming the things that Jesus has revealed to be true throughout his earthly ministry. What are some of the promises of this world that are not true? What are the true promises of Jesus?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
