Gospel Clarity

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 20:1-3, 7-11, Psalm 51
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point on Sunday was, "The Issue of Sin Is Clear." How did Israel decided to deal with the sin of the men of Gibeah? What are we to do with all of our known sins? How does David show us we should pray concerning our sin in Psalm 51?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 20:35-48, Numbers 32:23
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point on Sunday is that "The Cost of Sin Is Severe." What happened to the Benjamites who tried to protect sinners and what happened to Gibeah? What does this teach us about the way God views sin? How does God protect those who repent of their sins? Read 2 Corinthians 5:21. How did Christ pay for the penalty of our sins? What is repentance? (Turning from our sin to Christ for forgiveness)

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Judges 21:25
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's last point on Sunday was, "Who Is Your King?" What does a king do for his
 people? What does it mean to have God as our king? How do we know what God as king requires of us?

Thursday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Psalm 23
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?
- Close in Prayer

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Psalm 23
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
