Sermon Meditations: The Way To Heaven

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 11:1-26
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first and second point was "Obedience and Human Effort." Why is it so important to be obedient to God? How does our obedience show that we love God? The people of this chapter tried to build a tower to heaven to be where God is. Why is the not the way to God's presence? Why can't we save ourselves by human effort?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 11:1-26 or Phil 2:9-11
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "Self-Worship." The people in this passage wanted to make a name for themselves for their own glory. How was this disobedient to God? Why is it that we are only saved by the name of Jesus? How does the lesson in this passage direct us to worship God alone?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 11:1-26
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "God's Way of Salvation." God confuses the people's language and disperses them out over the earth. He also shows that he will choose out of the nation's one family that leads to Abram. God has a plan to save people through this family that will ultimately lead to the blessing of all people. God is showing he has a plan to save people through the coming messiah. Why should we trust God's plan? How do we receive salvation through trusting in Christ?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
