Sermon Meditations: Walking in Faith

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 11:27-12:9
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first and second point was "The Call of the Gospel." Abram and his family were living in Ur and were idol-worshippers like the nations around them. God calls Abram out of his sin into a relationship with promises to bless him and give him a family. God calls us to himself while we are sinners. The gospel is a gracious gift of mercy. How does God show grace to us in giving his Son for our salvation and what is the right response to this call?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 12:1-9, Acts 2:37-39
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "The Response to the Gospel." Abram immediately packs up his possession and takes his wife and goes to where God is sending him. How does Abram's response show his faith? What promises did he have? What promises does God give us and how does faith respond to those promises? (believe and repent- Acts 2:37-39)
- Close in prayer

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 12:1-9
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "The Gospel is the Hope of the Nations." Abram is sent to Canaan, and he begins worshipping God by setting up altars. Abram believed God, had faith, and now shares that faith to the nations. This is the beginning of the gospel going to the world. What does this teach us about faith and sharing our faith with others?

- Read: Genesis 12:10-20
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

Friday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 12:10-20
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior?
