Sermon Meditations: The Promised One

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 19:28-42
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Our Faithful Triune God". The repeated formula – "to fulfill the Scripture" (John 18:9, 32; 19:24, 28) – points to the fact that God had ordained all these things, foretold them in Scripture, and fulfilled them in Jesus Christ. God is sovereign and faithful. He can be trusted! Are you trusting him every day? Are you trusting him for your eternal salvation?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 19:28-42; Exodus 12:21-27
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Our Willing Passover Lamb". Throughout our verses John is giving us clues that Jesus is the true Passover lamb. Do you remember what the Passover lamb accomplished in Exodus 12? The blood of that lamb was a sign to the angel of death that the people in this house belong to God and so they were saved from death. Jesus is our Passover lamb – you are his and you are protected from death and hell by faith in him. Trust in Christ and be comforted. Trust in Christ and be confident!

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 19:28-42; Zechariah 12:10-13:1
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Our Perfectly Accomplished Salvation". There can be no question that everything needed for our salvation has been provided in the life and death of Jesus Christ. He has done it. It is finished. Give thanks to God for his perfect salvation!

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Open in Prayer
- Read: John 20:1-10
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
