**Instruction:** Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

**Sermon Meditations: Soli Deo Gloria**

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 9:1-41 (or 1-7)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "All mankind exists to serve and glorify the Triune God." The disciples are focused on sin – what the man or his parents had done, but Christ wants them to focus on God and what he is doing and will do! The man's blindness will be used by God in this passage to accomplish so many things! One of them has already happened in the first seven verses. What do you think he has done already?

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 9:1-41 (or 8-34)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Believers must testify to and even suffer for Christ." Christ has done a great thing for and in and through the blind man. Now the man's response is at the center of the story. What does the blind man keep telling anyone who asks? How is he an example to those of us who have also been healed by Jesus from our sin and guilt and spiritual blindness?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: John 9:1-41 (or 35-41)
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Christ came to judge and his judgment is true." Jesus came to heal the blind – not primarily those whose eyes don't work as they should, but those who are spiritually blind. Someone who is spiritually blind cannot see the truth unless they are healed of their blindness. Then they can see the truth! The blind man now sees and believes. The Pharisees won't even admit that they are blind! So they will not be healed. Jesus is the light of the world. Have you admitted you are blind and need healing? If you haven't, will you?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Read: John 10:1-6
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
