Instruction: Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

Sermon Meditations: Shall not the Judge of the earth do what is just?

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 18:22-33 and Romans 3:22
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's first point was "Who is righteous?" Abraham prays that God would spare the city for the sake of the righteous. What does it mean to be righteous? How do we become righteous? Righteousness is not based upon our works. What is our only hope to be saved from God's wrath?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 18:22-33
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's second point was "Will you sweep away the righteous with the wicked?" Abraham knows that God is merciful and just. He is also concerned with God's reputation among the nations. How does the impending judgment of Sodom inform his prayer life? How should we be praying for both the believer and unbeliever?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 18:22-33, John 17, Luke 23:34
- Meditation: Pastor Nathan's third point was "Who intercedes for us?" Abraham intercedes for the believer and the non-believer before God. Christ prays for believers and for non-believers. What does this teach us about God's desire for believers and unbelievers? What does this passage teach us will happen to the wicked? How should it instruct our prayers lives? Who can you pray for to receive God's mercy?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?"
 Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God
 requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach
 us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of
 Christ?
