**Sermon Meditations: It's All About Who You Know**

Monday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 19:23-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "God's Wrath Is Certain" As day runs into day and year into year, it is easy to forget that God has promised a day of wrath and that day will surely come. Have you taken refuge in Christ alone? Who do you know that needs to be told about the coming wrath of God?

Tuesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 19:23-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "God's Wrath Is Complete" It's possible that some people believe God's wrath is coming – they want it to come because they know the world is a mess. The problem is, they think they will find a way to escape it themselves. Usually, they think they will hide in their good works. Will there be anywhere to hide other than in Christ? How do we hide in Christ?

Wednesday

- Open in Prayer
- Read: Genesis 19:23-38
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "God's Wrath Is Satisfied" If God's wrath is certain and it is complete, then what hope do we have of escaping it? Just like Lot was saved because God remembered Abraham, we will be saved because God will remember his Son. We are saved for Christ's sake. If God does not save us, it is Christ he disappoints. Do you think God will disappoint Christ? What does this mean for us?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
