**Instruction:** Whatever time of day works best each day for you or your family, use the prompts below to spend a few minutes together in prayer and the Word. Open and close each session with a simple prayer. Use the questions for meditation or discussion.

### **Sermon Meditations: From Generation to Generation**

## Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 48:1-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "God's Covenant Faithfulness". Notice Jacob's restatement of the covenant promises in verses 3-4. Jacob knows and believes these promises and passes them to the next generation as an act of faith. What are the most important promises God has made to us, his people who trust in Christ? Reviewing those promises and telling them to the coming generations is so important!

### Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 48:1-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "God's Mysterious Ways". In verse 11, Jacob expresses joy (and maybe a little surprise!) that he has not only seen Joseph again, but also his sons. This is so much more than he had ever expected after hearing that his son was almost surely dead! Jacob suffered the loss of his son for more than 20 years, but God was at work in ways he knew nothing of. Even when it seems to us that God is not there, that he is silent, that he doesn't care, despite how painful the experience is, we can trust him to be at work for our good!

## Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Genesis 48:1-22
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "God's Sovereign Choice". For perhaps the last time in Genesis we see the younger being elevated over the older (twice in this passage!). Culture demanded that the older receive the preeminence. And there is nothing wrong with this demand of culture! But God is not bound by our cultural norms. He is free to break those norms for his purposes. Our cultural norms sometimes cause us to think God will or must act a certain way. But God is free and able to act in whatever way he chooses, always in perfect wisdom, love, and justice.

What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
