**Sermon Meditations: The Kingdom Will Be Restored**

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Acts 1:6-11
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Jesus' Kingdom Rule Now". In these verses we see Jesus' ascension. He isn't simply leaving or disappearing but being coronated and entering his kingdom rule. The Kingdom over which Christ rules is a present Kingdom, though it is not now revealed as fully as it will be. What comfort can we take now from this reality?

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Acts 1:6-11
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Jesus' Kingdom Power Always". When he departs, Jesus blesses his people and promises they will receive the power of the Holy Spirit. This is the same power by which Jesus did all of his miracles. It is an infinite power limited only by God in his infinite wisdom. In Acts 1 Jesus tells us this power is for us in the completion of our Kingdom mission to spread the good news of the gospel. What are ways we can participate in this mission as Christians? What are specific ways you can participate?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Acts 1:6-11
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Jesus' Kingdom Consummated Forever". Part of our celebration of Advent is the anticipation of Christ's second coming, when his Kingdom will be consummated – made perfect – and fully revealed to all creation. On that day all, of the hope we have in Christ will be fully and perfectly realized. This is so certain that we can not only put our hope in it without fear, but we can thank God even now that it will happen. What a sure hope we have in the midst of the day's troubles!

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
