Sermon Meditations: The King will Save His People

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Zechariah 9:9-17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Salvation is from the Lord alone." In these verses a great battle is described and God is the protector of his people! They cannot fail and the enemy will be destroyed. Christian, do you find yourself turning to other things hoping they will save you or keep you from despair? Turn to Christ anew every day for the comfort and hope that you need!

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Zechariah 9:9-17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Salvation will come suddenly when God has ordained it." It is the consistent testimony of Scripture that when Christ comes again, it will be sudden. Zechariah records that it will be like a flash of lightning and with a trumpet sound! We may think it is taking a very long time; we may wonder if he will ever come again; the enemy may taunt us that our hope is in vain; but He is coming and it will be sudden. Are you ready?

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: Zechariah 9:9-17
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Salvation will mean our glorification and the destruction of the wicked." When Christ comes again it will be for our salvation and the judgment of the wicked – all those who have not trusted in Christ alone for their salvation. We must hope in this and rejoice in its coming, but we must also tell the lost who do not know. Are you eager for Christ to come again? Are you telling others about it so they can rejoice as well?

- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Read: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
