Sermon Meditations: The Appointed Day

Monday

- Open in prayer
- Read: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11; 1 Corinthians 15:51-52
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's first point was "Our hope". Look through our passage and see what our hope is...what do we look forward to when Jesus comes again?
- Close in prayer

Tuesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's second point was "Our confidence". How is Paul so confident about these things? What has happened in history to secure these things for us without and fear of them not happening? How can we have the confidence of Paul?
- Close in prayer

Wednesday

- Open in prayer
- Read: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11
- Meditation: Pastor Matt's third point was "Our charge". Twice Paul gives the command in these verses – "Therefore, encourage one another..." Paul wants us to use these truths to encourage one another. Are you encouraged by them? Will you encourage other Christians by reminding them of these things?

- Read: 2 Peter 3:1-15a
- Meditation: What questions do you have about this text? Is there anything confusing or curious? Does anything stand out as important?

- Read: 2 Peter 3:1-15a
- Meditation: Westminster Shorter Catechism Question 4 asks, "What do the Scriptures principally teach?" Answer: "The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God and what duty God requires of man." What does this passage teach us about God's character and work? What does it teach us about our own hearts and need for a Savior and how we ought to live in the world as followers of Christ?
