


"So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive His mercy, and we will find grace to help us when we need it most." (Hebrews 4:16)

Then everyone was encouraged and began to eat—all 276 of us who were on board." (Acts 27: 33-37)



I love this story and this passage from "Paul's Shipwreck" for several reasons. One, because I understand the nautical part of the story and the predicament presented. Also, the hopelessness and misery in this story match and probably exceed anything most of us will experience in our lifetime. But mostly, I love the number 276 written so precisely and matter-of-fact: not "a lot of people," not "everyone" or "most" or "some." 276 souls with names and histories and futures, all sharing in the experience of being "saved" by our loving God.

My dream and prayer is that we as a church will soon number 276 souls; and when that day comes, my dream and my prayer is that we will stand together and share the story of God's love and salvation with each other and with our world, just like these poor shipwrecked souls did so many years ago.

"Dear Lord, Help us to be people and a church that can share the story of being saved from our own "shipwrecks" by your love and the sacrifice of Jesus.






