THE DOCTRINE OF THE GREATNESS OF GOD

WHAT WE TEACH

We teach that there is but one true and living God, an infinite, eternal, all- knowing Spirit, who is transcendent, unchanging and perfect in all His attributes. We believe that He is one eternally existing entity, manifested in three distinct Persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, each equally deserving of reverence, worship, and obedience. He exhibits an array of perfections or attributes which define the mode of His existence and constitutes His character. Certain attributes are unique to God alone (omniscience, omnipotence, eternality, self-existence, immutability, etc.), and are therefore described as incommunicable attributes. There are however communicable attributes which, to a limited degree, He bestows upon His creatures and which man can reflect (justice, grace, mercy, love, faithfulness, etc.).

THE BIG PICTURE

God's infinite perfections (or attributes) are described in Scripture so that we can better understand who He is.

OBJECTIVES FOR THIS SESSION

1. To be able to name and describe the perfections of God's greatness discovered in this session, namely God's spirituality, His personhood, His inherent life, and His immutability.

2. To increase our knowledge of God 's nature to the end that our minds will be renewed and our wills more conformed to God's will.

3. To deepen our worship, respect, and love for our great God.
