1 THESSALONIANS 5:6-11 THE DAY OF THE LORD (PART TWO)

1 Review the theme and key verses of 1 Thessalonians along with the summary and objectives for chapter 5:

Holiness in view of the coming of Christ

"And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints" (1 Th 3:12-13).

Continuing his apostolic instructions, Paul knows he does not need to write the Thessalonians concerning the timing of the Lord's coming, for they had been taught already that He will come as a thief in the night and sudden destruction catching many people unexpectedly (vv 1-3). Such should not be the case for Christians, however, for they are children of light and children of the day. Therefore they should be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation (vv 4-8). Knowing that God has appointed them to obtain salvation through Jesus Christ, they know that whether dead or alive they will live with Christ. Being given such hope, they should encourage and edify one another (vv 9-11).

Our objective for this passage is to understand the unexpected nature of the coming of the Lord (vv 1-5) and how we should prepare for that event (vv 6-11).
