> In 1 Thessalonians 3:6-13, Timothy brought back good news to Paul concerning the church at Thessalonica, telling him of their faith and love, their fond memories of Paul, and their desire to see him again. This greatly comforted Paul who was suffering his own afflictions and he is overwhelmed with thankfulness and joy. Praying night and day that he might see them again and perfect what is lacking in their faith, he offers a prayer that both the Father and Jesus the Son might direct his way back to them. He also prays that the Lord will help them abound in love to one another, and to establish their hearts blameless in holiness before God at the coming of Christ with all His saints.
