**THE BIG IDEA**

God has revealed his perfection of integrity and truth in Scripture so that we can better understand who he is and glorify him. God’s perfections describe him as both infinitely great and infinitely good.

The integrity of God displays his goodness. Scripture affirms that God is the source of truth, the final standard of truth, and that he “keeps (or guards) truth forever” (Ps 146:6).

**OBJECTIVES FOR THIS SESSION**

- 1) To understand and articulate the meaning of integrity and truth, the source of truth, the final standard of truth, and the application of truth to the life of the believer
- 2) To understand and be able to define the three dimensions of truth: 1) God’s genuineness, 2) God’s veracity, and 3) God’s faithfulness
- 3) To deepen our worship, respect, and love for our good God.

**KEY VERSE TO MEMORIZE**

*“But the LORD is the true God, he is the living God, and an everlasting king....”* (Jeremiah 10:10)

—OR—

*“God is not man, that He should lie.... Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not fulfill it?”* (Numbers 23:19)

**THE DOCTRINE OF GOD’S GOODNESS — PART TWO: HIS INTEGRITY**

**Definition:** *Integrity* means the quality of being honest.... of being whole and undivided... of being unified, unimpaired.... an internal consistency or lack of corruption (New Oxford American Dictionary, excerpts).

**Definition:** *Truth* means that which conforms with reality and fact—or simply, what is real.

“The cluster of attributes classifying as integrity relates to the matter of truth. There are three dimensions of truthfulness: 1) genuineness— being true; 2) veracity— telling the truth; and 3) faithfulness—proving true. Although we think of truthfulness primarily as telling the truth, genuineness is the most basic dimension of truthfulness. The other two derive from it” (M. Erickson, *Introducing Christian Doctrine*, pg. 101).

Therefore, we can say that 1) God is true; 2) Because God is true, He tells the truth; 3) Because God is true, He proves true by keeping his promises.
