Key Passage to Memorize & Meditate Upon: 1 John 4:8-11 (LSB) The one who does not love does not know God, because God is love.⁹ By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him.¹⁰ In this is love, not that we have loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.
