If your student is not ready for the test on Friday, I would suggest using the Chapter Review and Test from the book first. Pages 185-190. Also, problems from the **class packet** can be practiced.

Please emphasize the concept of "betweenness". If $6 < x \leq 10$. Then x is between 6 and 10, including the 10 but not the 6. The inequality signs ($<$ and $>$) must always point in the same direction to show this.

Also, a very common careless mistake involves when to switch the inequality sign.

If $-2x > 8$ then $x < -4$ but if $3x < -12$ then $x < -4$.

The inequality sign is switched only when we multiply or divide **BY** a negative number.

Reminder—All homework needs to include the necessary work for the problems in a neat fashion. I do not want to see a list of answers and then some scratch work somewhere else or not at all. Also, each homework assignment should be checked and corrected when possible.
