Financial Agreement

Full-Time Students

We understand that Blackburn Study Center makes financial decisions based upon its projected annual revenue. We agree that by registering our child(ren) in Blackburn Study Center, we are obligated to pay for a full year's tuition for each of our children enrolled in Blackburn Study Center. In the event that a student who is registered in Blackburn Study Center on a full-time basis wishes to withdraw from Blackburn Study Center between July 15 and the first day of Blackburn Study Center's academic year, the student's parents remain obligated to pay one-quarter of the full year's tuition. In the event that a student who is registered in Blackburn Study Center on a full-time basis wishes to withdraw from Blackburn Study Center after the first day of Blackburn Study Center's school year, but before the completion of the first semester, the student's parents remain obligated to pay one-half of the full year's tuition. In the event that a student who is registered in Blackburn Study Center on a full-time basis wishes to withdraw from Blackburn Study Center after December 31, the student's parents remain obligated to pay one-half of the tuition remaining from the date of withdrawal to the end of the school year.

A La Carte Students

We understand that Blackburn Study Center makes financial decisions based upon its projected annual revenue. We agree that we will notify Blackburn Center of the student's final selection of *a la carte* classes no later than the date of the family interview. If the student wishes to drop a class(es) between July 15 and the first day of Blackburn Study Center's school year, the parents remain responsible to pay Blackburn Study Center one-quarter of the full year's tuition per dropped class, in addition to the full tuition for those classes for which the student remains enrolled. If the student wishes to drop a class(es) *after* the first day of Blackburn Study Center's school year, the parents remain responsible to pay Blackburn Study Center one-half of the balance of the full year's tuition per dropped class, in addition to the full tuition for those classes for which the student remains enrolled. Please note that preference will be given to those students applying for full-time admission. Enrollment for full-time applicants will remain open until July 31. Part-time applicants who may lose their spot will be notified of such and will be given the option of switching to full-time enrollment in order to retain their spot. After July 31, any open class spots will be filled on a first-come, first served basis without respect to full-time or part-time status. Therefore, no part-time student will lose their spot in a class after July 31, even if another application for full-time enrollment is received after July 31.

Methods of Payment

Payments are due on the first of each month starting with August. Families may choose to pay the full year's tuition at once, two semester payments, or 10 monthly payments (August – May). Payment is by secure ACH withdrawals. The ACH forms must be received by July 1 or the student will be moved to the wait list and may be replaced by the first paying applicant on the list. There will be no month-to-month tuition payment plan. A fee of \$30.00 will be charged for dishonored checks.
