The information on page 322 will be helpful in science classes.

It is important for the students to remember that there are only 3 types of solutions to a linear system: one point, no points, or all points on the line. Because "all points on the line" is an infinite number of solutions, the students may want to say "any point". This is not correct, only points on the line are solutions. In this case the lines are on top of each other, or actually the same line, coinciding.

In this chapter, it is common for the students to pick their favorite method(s) and not practice the others. Moving forward in Algebra, it is important that they are comfortable with <u>all</u> of the methods.

Please continue to stress that correct use of the vocabulary is necessary. p. 319
