This will be a more difficult week for most of the students. Word problems can be a challenge.

Remind the students that there are geometry formulas in the front and back of their book. None of these formulas will need to be memorized for Chapter 2, but it would be a good idea to put some on a notecard. They will need these formulas next year.

Also difficult is the task of solving for a specified variable, (or solving a literal equation).

It helps them quite a bit to just think of it as "rearranging" the equation. See ex. 6 on p.151

This idea of *solving* and not getting a number answer is mysterious for now. They have some background in arithmetic with "fact families". If 3 + 2 = 5 then 3 = 5 - 2. So if x + 2 = y then x = y - 2. They have **solved for** x even though x doesn't equal a number.

The students should always be studying the examples in the book and reading the material. I can tell already that some of them are doing just that! If they need to spend more than 5 hours per week on studying and assignments, please inform me.
